Guidelines for Symposium Abstract Submission

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General Abstract Submission Guidelines

- Each abstract should be no more than 750 words and should clearly and concisely summarize the content of the presentation, identify questions or issues addressed and outline the results or conclusions.
- All information should be presented in a clear and concise manner using the following headings where possible; Purpose, Method, Results, Discussion, Practical Application/ Clinical relevance.
- All subheadings should be in bold.
- Graphics (i.e., graphs, tables, images, etc.) must be cited in the abstract text. The abstracts themselves must be in text, not table format. All figures should be cited in the text of the abstract.
- Arial 10 point font should be used for the abstract text. Formatting is preserved (italics, bold, superscripting, subscripting, underlining) and symbol characters (ie ± , μ, ß) may be used.
- Abstracts must be free of typographical and grammatical errors.
- Standard abbreviations may be used for common terms only. Otherwise, any abbreviation should be given in brackets after the first full use of the word. Abbreviations may be used in the title, provided the name in full is outlined in the body of the abstract.
- The WSCG Congress uses APA (American Psychological Association) formatting.
- You will be asked to provide a short biography (up to 150 words) with your submission
- Submit as a Microsoft Word document or Adobe .pdf.

3. Title

Capitalize the first letter of each word in the title except for prepositions of less than four letters and articles that do not begin the title (i.e., do NOT capitalize a, an, the, in, out, by, of, for; DO capitalize With, Among, About). Titles may not exceed 15 words.

4. Brief Description:

Symposia authors should provide a short (100-word maximum) paragraph to provide a general introduction of the topic and individual presentations. This description is intended to give a general overview of the purpose, content, and importance of the session.

5. Lead Author:

You will need to indicate which author will take primary responsibility for presenting at the conference. Provide name, mailing address, telephone number and email address of the person who will take the primary role to organize the symposium.

6. Discussant:

If you intend to have a discussant (i.e., researcher or practitioner/professional) to comment on the presentations contained in your symposium, please provide his/her name, mailing address, telephone number and email address. Discussants do not need to provide an abstract.

7. Symposium Abstracts

A. Title of Abstract

Capitalize the first letter of each word in the title except for prepositions of less than four letters and articles that do not begin the title (i.e., do NOT capitalize a, an, the, in, out, by, of, for; DO capitalize With, Among, About). Titles may not exceed 15 words.

B. Authors of Abstract

Provide name(s), mailing address(es), telephone number(s), and email address(es) for each author for each specific abstract. Please indicate the "presenting" author for each abstract.

C. Abstract

Each abstract must be 750 words or less. Please be careful to check spelling and ensure the abstract is as clean as possible before submission. Abstracts should contain the following sections: (a) Purpose – briefly outline the background for your research and guiding research questions, (b) Method – describe participants/objects/events, measures, and procedures, (d) Analysis/Results – present any statistical or

analytical methods and your findings, and (e) Conclusions – place your findings in context and indicate their potential impact on the field.

ALL PRESENTATIONS ARE REQUIRED TO USE THE WSCG 2016 WORKSHOP PRESENTATION TEMPLATE.

Instructions Symposium Template

The 2016 World Scientific Congress of Golf VII Abstract Template for Symposium submissions has been created to assist submitting a properly formatted Abstract. The formatting includes correct margins, correct font size, correct spacing, and, proper subheadings as defined in the APA (American Psychological Association) Style Guide. The template has been created for Microsoft Word 2007 and formatted for you using Content Controls and Placeholder Text.

- The best way to submit your paper to get accepted is to have great research and use APA format.

Adding Your Content

All formatting should be removed from the original text before adding it to the Abstract Template.

- 1. To add your content directly to the Abstract Template :
 - Click on the Placeholder Text location in the Abstract Template.
 - Type your content directly. The Placeholder Text will disappear and be replaced with your content and will be formatted.
- 2. To add formatted content:
 - Paste your text into Notepad
 - Choose Edit -> Select All (This will highlight all text)
 - Choose Edit -> Copy
 - Click on the Placeholder Text location in the Abstract Template
 - Click on the Paste button in the Clipboard group. The Placeholder Text will disappear and be replaced with your content and will be formatted.

Adding References

The References section does not contain any Placeholder Text. You will need to add this information. References can be added to your abstract can be added a few different ways:

Word Count

Keep an eye on the word count in your document. The abstract must be 750 words or less. There are 2 ways to determine the word count:

- Using the Review tab
 - Click on the **Review** tab

- Click on Word Count
- A box appears with your statistics for your document
- Using the Status Bar:
 - Right click on the status bar at the bottom of the page
 - Click **Word Count** to display the word count at the bottom left corner of your document.

Once you have created your SymposiumAbstract submission, save it as a word document (not template) or a pdf in a place you will remember.

Instructions for the Symposium Online Form

The form for the Symposium Abstract will display 9 screens. There are several screens; General Information, Adding a Discussant, Submitting an Abstract, Adding Author Information for each abstract. When adding the Authors each screen contains a progress bar to let you know where you are in the process of adding the authors form. Required fields are noted with an asterisk (*). You can move forward through the form by clicking on the 'Next' button. You can always click the 'Previous' button to go back to preceding pages.

Filling out this form is easy. You choose the Major Section, Review Category, and add the Symposium Title and a Brief Description and choose to include a Discussant for this Symposium. You will be uploading each Abstract and then add the author(s) information for each Abstract. Please be sure to indicate the Lead Author and the Presenting Author for each Abstract.

Errors

If you neglect to fill out a required field the form will display the error section or sections with the display background in red. You cannot move forward until the problem has been fixed. The top of the page will say '**There was a problem with your submission. Errors have been highlighted below.**'
